Periodic Comprehensive Review of the External Auditor: Tool for Audit Committees

As recommended by the Enhancing Audit Quality (EAQ) initiative, audit committees should conduct a comprehensive review of external auditors at least every five years, to provide a deeper and broader analysis of external auditor performance than an annual assessment. Periodic Comprehensive Review of the External Auditor — Tool for Audit Committees provides guidance on the preparation and content of the audit committee's public report, so your audit committee can: identify potential areas where the external audit firm can improve, identify potential areas where your audit committee can improve oversight, reach a final conclusion on whether the auditor should be reappointed or the audit should be put out for tender.
